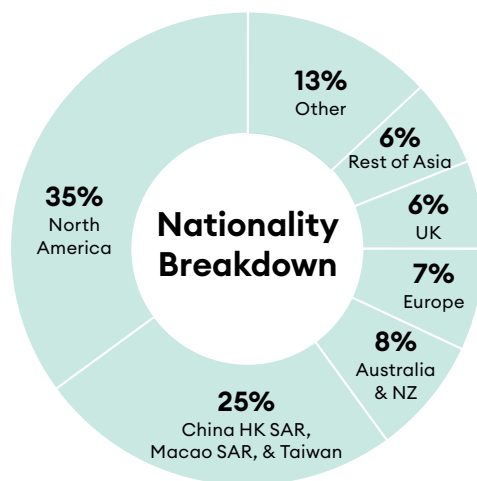
## Our School

This partnership includes staff visits and training as well as annual reviews by TWC administrators. WCC now has five campuses across China offering both international and bilingual educational systems culminating in either the IB or A Level examinations.

## CCA Programme

- All pupils in years 9 – 11 are required to participate in two co-curricular activities (CCAs) but may take part in 4+ depending on their interest and timetable.
- Popular options include Model United Nations, the British Science Olympiads (biology, chemistry, physics), and the Duke of Edinburgh program.
- A significant number of year 12 and 13 pupils create and/or run a CCA, often as their IB CAS project.

## Arts Programme

- Performing arts classes and programmes – including music, drama, and dance – are overseen by specialist teachers with professional performance backgrounds.
- The performing arts programme annually puts on three professional-quality plays or musicals as well as smaller productions, with pupils always involved both on stage and in technical support.
- In the music programme, instrumental specialists run lessons for pupils during the school day. The school has three orchestras, three choirs, a full big band, as well as smaller musical ensembles and groups performing classical, jazz, rock and pop.

## Sports Programme

- Pupils can participate in a wide range of sports at varying levels of competition and commitment, including recreational, competitive and Sports Fellowships (see Fellowship Programme below).
- Competitive teams include multiple practices a week plus competitions in Shanghai, across China and/or internationally.
- Competitive sports include basketball, volleyball, football (soccer) and swimming.

## House System

- All pupils are assigned to one of eight houses for community building throughout the year.
- Events include sporting competitions, singing and debate contests, fundraising challenges and more.
- Houses are led by pupils in a variety of leadership roles, and the entire system is coordinated by the Director of Houses.

## Fellowship Programme

- Enrichment programmes in the areas of academics, the arts and sports.
- Academic Fellows engage in super-curricular assignments, independent research, enrichment events and presentations. Selection is based on grades, exam results, interviews and future goals.
- Arts and Sports Fellows are expected to make a substantial commitment to teams or activities in those areas. Selection is based on tryouts, auditions and interviews.

## Scholarship Programme

- Scholarships are awarded through a competitive selection process to pupils in the areas of academics, the arts and sports to pupils in years 11 and up.
- Year 11 pupils can receive up to a 50% tuition reduction; pupils in years 12 and 13 are eligible for a 100% tuition reduction.
- Wellington also offers additional bursaries (tuition reductions) for pupils based on families' means.



# iGCSE Classes & Results

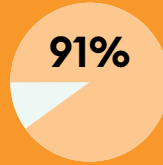
Pupils in years 10 and 11 complete nine to 11 iGCSE courses that culminate in externally examined qualifications using a scale of either A\*-G (Cambridge) or 9-1 (Edexcel). To the right you can find some highlights of results from our 2023 testing cohort.



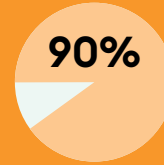
3 pupils (4%) achieved perfect scores (all A\* or 9)



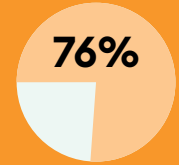
14 pupils (21%) achieved all A\* - A (9 - 8)



91% of pupils achieved an A\* or A grade in **Physics**



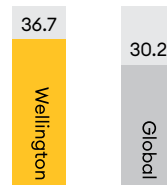
90% of pupils achieved an A\* or A grade in **Mathematics**

# IB Classes & Results

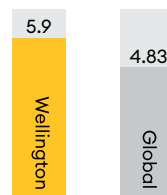

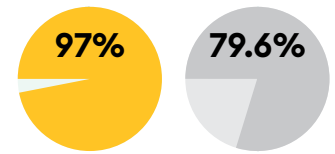
IB average score

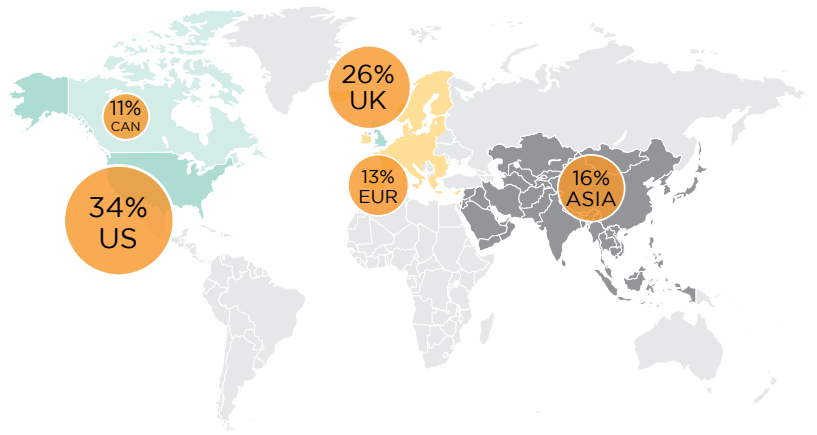
