SCHOLARS PROGRAMME

Huili School Shanghai has two scholarship programmes: the Shuping Scholarship and the Academic Scholarship. The academic scholarship is open to current and new junior high and high school students and recognises outstanding academic achievement and all-round excellence. Huili Scholars have a consistent and proven track record of excellent academic performance, demonstrate leadership potential, show unfailing kindness to their peers and have an exemplary behavioural record as well as acting as mentors and role models.



- The SHUPING SCHOLARSHIP is the most prestigious scholarship offered at Wellington College China. It is targeted at outstanding students in grade 8 and above, who are from Chinese working-class families. The scholarship includes a financial award of up to 110% of the annual tuition fee.
- The HUILI ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP recognises outstanding academic achievement and all-round excellence. It is targeted at students who enter grade 6 and above and includes financial awards of up to 50% of the annual tuition fee.

WCC Huili School Shanghai was founded in 2018 and is part of Wellington College China, which is a partner of The Wellington College, one of the top co-educational private schools in the United Kingdom. HUILI CHARITY PROGRAMME

The Shanghai United Foundation 'Friends of Huili' (SUF FOH) Charity Fund was launched in December 2019 and is the first donor-advised fund created by parents and the school in China. As a top public charity and class 5A foundation, Shanghai United Foundation works closely with Huili School Shanghai to identify the most innovative and beneficial models of charitable education. Shanghai United Foundation (SUF) is the first independent public grant-making foundation in Shanghai. The SUF focuses on creating a culture where participants can achieve personal and social value through engaging in philanthropy and providing grants to a wide range of charitable projects on a highly accountable basis. We are very proud that, in 2021, our junior high students initiated and successfully completed the first ever youth grantmaking project in China. In the same year, Huili School Shanghai was awarded the award for being in the top 10 charity campuses in Shanghai. The charity projects currently running on campus are: Huili Organic Farm, associated school project partnership with the Special Olympics, the minority culture project and a support programme for the children of migrant workers.

HUILI ARTS PROGRAMME

The arts programme offered through Huili Arts Earlybird training sessions, extended CCA time and 1-to-1 coaching sessions demonstrates our eastmeets-west approach in action. From Chinese opera, Chinese instrumental study and traditional Chinese arts such as painting, printing and calligraphy right through to hip-hop dance, contemporary dance, classical drama, musical theatre and digital art studio teams, students have access to a varied and celebrated selection of introductory, developmental and elite ensembles. Leadership opportunities underpin our desire to allow students to be part of their own artistic development: Arts Stars in primary take part in lesson leadership whist Arts Captains in secondary are coveted roles who help plan, organise and lead key arts events such as our Huili Arts Days, our Huili Art and Design Exhibition and our charity partnership work.

SPORTS PROGRAMME

Students at Huili School Shanghai have opportunities to participate in physical activity both within and outside lessons. Within the curriculum, the focus is on developing physical literacy, an understanding of health and fitness and a passion for different sports and activities. At IGCSE, students have the option of choosing IGCSE Physical Education and at IBDP, Sports, health and exercise science is offered as a course. Outside the curriculum, the school have 5 core sports: basketball, football, swimming, table tennis and badminton. Teams compete regularly in the local league and a number of students go on to represent their districts. Non-core sports include fencing, golf, athletics and volleyball. Students may participate in all sports at entry, development or elite level.

IGCSE CURRICULUM AND RESULTS

In Grades 9 and 10, students complete the Cambridge International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSEs) which result in externally marked examinations. In Grade 9, students also complete the Zhongkao which examines the content and understanding from the Chinese national curriculum. IGCSEs are the world's most popular international qualification for 14–16-year-olds and are taken by students from over 145 countries around the world. Each IGCSE is a two-year course and results in a final grade of A*-G, with U signifying a failure to meet minimum standards.

At Huili School Shanghai, students study compulsory subjects and have a choice of electives.

The following subjects are compulsory:









Chinese First Language

English

*Students will study either English First or English Second Language; some students will also study English Literature.

Students must choose one social studies subject from the following: History, Geography, or Global Perspectives.

In addition, students must choose one science from Physics and Biology; some students elect to do all three and will cover three sciences in the same amount of time as others cover two.

Finally, students choose two further subjects from the following: History, Geography, Global Perspectives, Economics, Music, Art and Design, Drama, Computer Science, Spanish, PE (from 2022).

IBDP

In Grades 11 and 12, students will complete the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP)*. The IBDP is a highly rigorous international qualification that is externally assessed at the end of Grade 12. Students are required to study six subjects from the six IB subject groups, three at Higher Level (HL) and three at Standard Level (SL). Students may choose to substitute a group six subject for an additional subject from groups 1-4. In addition to the six subjects, students must complete the IB Core: Theory of Knowledge (TOK), Extended Essay (EE) and Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS). The table below shows the subjects offered at Huili School Shanghai.


